

Upcoming Programs

On Monday, 13 Nov 2023, at 7 PM: Do you have a Civil War ancestor? Is this family lore, or do you have proof? The Greene County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society spent 25 years and many volunteers proving 1328 Civil War veterans who are buried in Greene County, Ohio. This effort was at the request of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War who will use the data in their online database. We collected about 40 paper and online resources which were checked to verify these veterans. Cases of unmarked, moved markers and mistaken identity were (mostly) sorted out.

Presenter Catherine (Sidenstick) Leininger has been doing genealogy and has been a member of the Greene County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society for over 20 years. She is the co-author of this presentation and co-editor of the quarterly genealogy newsletter *Leaves of Greene* with Diana Robinson Nelson. Her ancestor surnames from Greene County from both sides of the family are Sidenstick, Ellis, Sroufe, Oxley, Frost, Boots, Bartlett, Campbell, and Dean, most of whom owned land and were farmers starting in 1803 in Beavercreek, Yellow Springs, Oldtown, New Jasper, Jamestown and Bowersville.

On Monday, 11 Dec 2023, at 7 PM: Bob Ford will present holiday themed music and stories. Bob has been here many times, but there is always something new to learn and enjoy from his vast store of tales and tunes.

As I write this on a dreary October afternoon, exciting things are happening locally. People from Ohio Department of Natural Resources and from Ohio History Connection were here today, talking about the new Great Council State Park at Oldtown. That project is moving forward, and is scheduled for opening next spring. Xenia Towne Square has been renamed The Market District, and renovation of the existing acres of parking lot into mixed retail and housing is shaping up. President's Corner by Ron Goble



UNESCO named Ohio's Hopewell Ceremonial Earthworks as a World Heritage Site in September. Only twenty-five sites in the entire United States are on this list. The earthworks are spread over eight locations, and all are open for visitation: Great Circle Earthworks, Octagon Earthworks, Mound City, Hopewell Mound Group, Hopeton Earthworks, High Bank Works, Seip Earthworks, and Fort Ancient. More online at www.hopewellearthworks.org. Fort Ancient, the site closest to our area, has a feature called Moorehead Circle after Greene County's own Warren King Moorehead.
